## MARCH SEW EXPO CHAIRPERSON NEEDED

Haven't I seen you at the SEW EXPO in February or March? If you love to shop and see all the different vendors, then we need your help! Each year MEOW has a booth at SEW EXPO that allows new and potential members to see our magnificent work and become inspired to join and continue our organization's work. To that end, we still need someone to volunteer to be the Spring Expo chairperson. We would ask you to be at the Fairgrounds for five (5) days in Puyallup (Feb. 25, 26, 27 and 28, 2010), with set up of the booth on Feb. 24<sup>th</sup>). 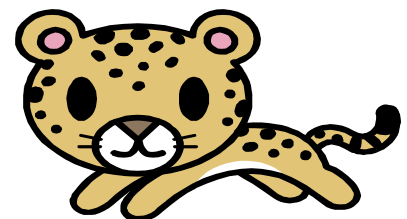
## Proofreaders

Vicki Nelson, President, called the meeting to order at 10:00 am. A sign-in sheet was passed around for the Board members and guests to sign to identify members that were present. See the following list:

Roll Call was taken and there was a quorum.

**Minutes of the last meeting:** Were approved as written.

The teachers proposals were presented prior to the beginning of the Board meeting (9:30 am) and voted on by the MEOW members that attended the meeting. We have 57 entries and 24 have been chosen for the 2010 Seminar brochure.

**Treasurer's Report:** All reimbursement forms for Directors are to be sent to Nancy Howard and then Jackie Rosier. The same goes for the Seminar reimbursement forms also.

We moved the Reserve for future Seminars into the 2009 budget.

To end the confusion as to the prepaid membership dues (those received prior to September 1), we will add a Prepaid Dues line to the proposed Budget. A question was asked as to why we have the MEOW year starting on September 1. This is because MEOW's first meeting was in August, 1988.

We discussed the need for an inhouse Audit now that we have a Certified Public Accountant doing the taxes. He will be taking care of that for us when doing the I.R.S. paperwork from now on. Nancy Shepherd made the motion and Claudia Buntyn seconded the motion, and it was approved by the members.

A motion was made by Jackie to approve the budget as presented and it was seconded by Nancy Shepherd. 13 Yes 0 No

**Vice-President's Report** - Community Service Reports will be requested of the Area Reps on a monthly basis. All final reports from Area Groups will be due on September 30<sup>th</sup>. A new form can be found under Publications and Forms on the Website. The Vice-President will then compile the final report as the information comes in.

If, as a Director, you can't visit your groups, please let the Vice-President know.

The Creative Cats have disbanded.

Nancy Howard has made up a new form for Area Reps and they will be sent to the Directors for dispersal.

If you can take time to teach at other groups (i.e. ,Border Cats and Fabricats), please contact the Area Rep. In the past the groups have been willing to provide bed and breakfast.

**Secretary's Report:** Sunshine Report – seven (7) cards were sent and the report is found later in the newsletter. Please make sure that you notify Carla LaBrousse if there is a need for a card, whatever the event may be. An e-mail from Robin Slocum of Purrfection was read and they would love to have you

stop in if you are in the area. I can say that it was the highlight of our trip to Idaho last year and we are looking forward to visiting again next March.

Karen handed out copies of the MEOW's Standing Rules with proposed changes. These will be discussed and voted on at the January Board meeting.

**Director's Reports:** Sali Lusk reported that the Seattle Katz are meeting now on the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday at the same time.

Texanna Cato has met with all of her new groups and asked the question as to how she goes about getting a response from her Area Groups. If there is no answer, just let the Vice-President and the Newsletter Editor know that there was no response.

Peggy Bodle reported that she met with the Designer Cats and they asked her to return next November, 2010, to teach a class, and they are working on their community service project.

Ruth Casciato reported that Multi-Media Kats are busy and so is McKits – see the reports later in the newsletter. She will be visiting her groups in October.

**Membership:** Sandy Radtke stated that we have 179 members at present with three (3) new members. We had 227 at this same time last year. Sandy turned in her expense report and handed out a roster to each Director showing which members in each group had renewed.

**Newsletter Report** – Tami Bennett stated that the last printed newsletter cost \$596.22 and 325 were printed. The price reduction was due in part because we didn't have two (2) inserts. We have nineteen (19) members that do not have e-mail and they will be receiving a hard copy, which will cost \$ .61 each to send.

**Scholarship:** Pat Bridwell is on her honeymoon at this time, so there was no report.

**Sew Expo:** Sali Lusk is the Chairperson for the November Expo and the dates are November 12 through 14<sup>th</sup>, 2009 and hours will be 10:00 to 5:00 pm. Anyone that is willing to work the booth will receive a free pass that will be good for all three (3) days. Sali is asking for samples to display in the booth, so bring them to your next meeting and arrangements can be made to obtain them. We need volunteers for the daily slots and they are 10:00 to 1:00 pm; 1:00 to 3:00 pm and 3:00 to 5:00 pm. **So please check your calendars and be ready to sign up when the call comes.**

A suggestion was made that the volunteer not working on the sewing machine doing a demo, might like to bring something that they can do also to show that MEOW is proficient in other venues.

A chairperson is still needed for the February Expo, which will be on February 25 through the 28<sup>th</sup>, 2010.

All samples for display must be turned in by the day of setup, which is Wednesday; the 11<sup>th</sup> of November and Wednesday, February 24<sup>th</sup>, if at all possible. We will try to make arrangements for displaying items brought after setup by our daily volunteers. Once the setup is in place, no changes are to be made.

The results of the survey that the Board of Directors requested that Jackie Rosier and Jyll Jones present to the membership are as follows: 170 were sent out by Jyll and she received 60 answers back. You will be able to find the questions and results up on the Website in the next two weeks. MEOW Scholarship Dollars used for: Lottery Method = 14 votes; All attendees = 43 votes, Have a yearly seminar 47 = Yes 2 = No; Plan on attending future seminar 40 = Yes 7 = No; Read the Newsletter: 47 out of 60 said yes; Use the Website: 36 = Yes 21 = No. These are just a few of the results; for more information please go up to the Website.

The cost of the Seminar will be \$300.00, which does not include kit fees and lodging. Raffle tickets were sent home with the Directors for pre-sale to go against the 2011 Seminar. If you run out, please contact Nancy Howard to get more. Please take some time and contact retailers that you deal with or where you meet to ask for a raffle donation. If you do receive a positive response, please also get a business card from them to keep with the item and send a personal thank you.

Judi Young proposed that we make 5 to 10 Artist Trading Cards for exchanging at Seminar. This will be used to meet new members to the Seminar and/or talk with others that you haven't seen for awhile. Make sure that you put your name and year made on the back. We will put up samples of the cards later on the Website.

There will be one catered meal per the hotel contract, which will be announced in the Seminar brochure.

The Sunday classes will be three (3) hours only. Starting time will be announced in the brochure.

The members will be notified when the brochure is going to be posted on the Website, and hard copies will be mailed to those that don't have e-mail.

Alice Morris will be the instructor for the Basics 101 class on Thursday. Sharing tables will be free for MEOOW members. We need at least four (4) surge protectors per classroom and two (2) extra just in case. The Treasure table will be handled differently at the next Seminar and more information on that will be forthcoming.

We went back to the general budget and made several amendments after going through the Seminar budget; and a motion to accept the budget as amended was made by Jackie Rosier and seconded by Sali Lusk. 13 = Yes 0 = No

Tami Bennett will be making the Community Service Report Form into an Excel format file so that it can be filled out by computer and printed.

Tami will be updating the Board of Directors page in the Newsletter and on the Website in the near future.

**Historian:** We are asking if there is anyone that would be interested in doing this job. You would not be required to attend Board meetings. The job consists of cataloging photos, seminar brochures and newsletters.

**Latimer Quilt Festival Show for MEOOW** is September 8 to November 8, 2009. MEOOW's Open House was on September 13, 2009; from noon to 4 p.m. and 55 attended. We had 250 items submitted and it took the committee all day on Sept. 8<sup>th</sup> to complete the display.

There is a link on the Website front page (Latimer) where you can see four of the items. Sandy Radtke sold an item prior to the opening ceremonies. Caroline Burton stated that Latimer wanted to know if we would be interested in doing this again, but with a specified theme. The consensus of the Board was yes. Caroline will contact Latimer to find out more about this. **November 8<sup>th</sup> is the last day and it would be well worth a field trip to go and see it for yourself.** If you wish to be an individual member of Latimer and receive a newsletter, the membership is \$10.00/year since MEOOW is already a member.

**NO PICTURES WILL BE ALLOWED AT THE SHOW** and a sign will be placed by Latimer stating this decision by the Board of Directors.

Nancy Shepherd presented the digitized pattern for the OR/WA Cats design, sayings from the seminar logos over the years, and a combination file of the cats with each saying that will be available to the membership on a C.D. All designs will fit into a 4 x 4 hoop. It will be available in pes, pcs, vip, jef, and hus. The logos are in different fonts. The cost of the full C.D. will be \$15.00 plus shipping with all monies going to MEOOW. Nancy passed around samples of the completed design with the different sayings.

We have several items that require payment by such a card – as in Domain Name, Website fee, etc., and it would be easier to have a card in our name. What constitutes an excused absence: Work, sick, death in family, in hospital, inclement weather and family matters.

A job description is needed for each Board position to complete our assigned task from last September. Each current Board member needs to read the description and update for their position and update if needed as we have made changes in several of those areas.

Board member abandoning office: It was discussed and the majority agreed that the consequence would be: 1. No longer eligible to hold office, and 2. No honorary membership status.

We began a discussion about lengthening the term office of the Executive Board members. The consensus was that we look into changing Article V, Section 3, to state that the Executive Officers shall be able to serve consecutively in the same position for 2 consecutive two - (2) year terms with the approval of the entire membership, because it takes more than two years to learn the workings of the office, especially with respect to the offices of the President and Treasurer.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

All forms and other information needing to be in the Director's books will be put up on the Website under Forms and Publications with revisions dates included so that each new Director can make sure that their books are current. This will be taken care of by the Secretary.

Texanna Cato made a motion that the meeting be adjourned and it was seconded by Sali Lusk. 13 =Yes 0 = No

The meeting was adjourned at 2:50 pm.

Our next meeting will be tentatively on January 23, 2010, at Vancouver, WA. Future board meetings are: April 24, 2010; and July 24, 2010, at Vancouver, WA, if possible.

**Email Etiquette by Tami Bennett**

They might help us understand why it is important to do things with regard to email that we do.

First, we have mentioned several times in the newsletter about the time it takes to answer an email. And that it would be nice for everyone to acknowledge the receipt of said email. We all know that the reason an email is sent is because someone has something to say and they wish a quick response, or they want to lighten our day, or they just want to say we were thinking of you. We need to tell that person we got it. Just like snail mail, things get lost and if they didn't wish a quick response, they would just send out a written letter or a fax or they might wait and give someone a call much later on. Therefore, each email should be replied to within at least 24 hours. If the email is complicated, just send back an email telling the person you received the email and you will get back to them. This will put the sender's mind at rest and usually they will be patient with you.

There is money in the fund for seven (7) \$100.00 Scholarships to the 2010 Seminar.

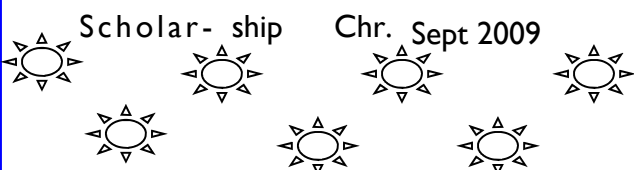

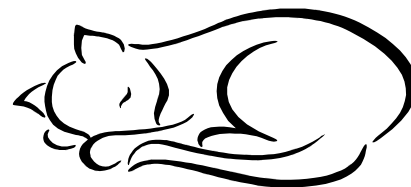

## Bobbin Work Instructions from Meow Newsletter February 1994

1. Trace pattern onto a piece of Muslin.
2. Use another piece of Muslin - turn cross grain and place both pieces in a hoop together.
3. Top tension should be on 3—4.
4. With Free Motion - Fill in eyes, nose, ears and mouth with straight stitch. Do outline with a back and forth heavy line. Match thread color to the color you plan to use for the project chosen (car, bear, etc.)
5. Do all embroidery work first (flowers, bows, ears, nose and mouth).
6. Bobbin stuff - Bobbin stuff is worked on the back side of fabric. Use punch embroidery thread in the bobbin. Run the thread up through the hole in the bobbin case, but not through the tension. Use invisible nylon thread in the needle.
7. Work short straight stitches in rows. Work in the same direction that fur grows. (If doing a cat or any other animal).
8. Lay rows of stitches close together but not on top of each other. You should not be able to see the Muslin on the front side of your fabric.
9. Brush out with an embroidery brush when finished (embroidery thread only)
10. Use Founder's Glu'n Wash permanent fabric adhesive on the back of your project. Be sure to cover it completely (especially the edges) and let dry.
11. Cut out and glue onto T-shirt or sweatshirt with the same glue. Put a piece of wax paper on the inside of shirt to prevent the garment from sticking together.

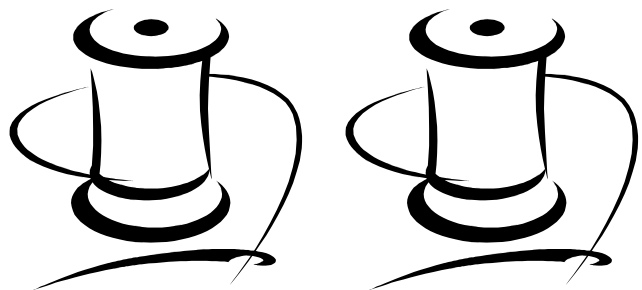
